

- •Staffing: 35% of our staff is BIPOC (72% of our staff are women)
- •Board: with new nominations approved as of January 1, 2023, our board will be 50% BIPOC
- Contract Employees: 50% BIPOC; Vendors 33%
- Racial Equity Giving Bonus product added UCC
 "Join the Movement" as a gift option
- Lending stats compare favorably to general population of UCC churches


